	<u>A Police report</u> was received by e-mail. During the last month there were 2 incidents of note in the Claife area, both concerns for welfare which were resolved positively. Overnight outbuilding break-ins are still occurring and parishioners are asked to ensure outbuildings and vehicles are secure.	
034/2020	<u>No County Council (CCC) or District Council reports were received.</u> An e-mail was received from Tracy Coward, District Councillor requesting the addition of a regular "Climate Focus" agenda item to every pc meeting agenda in light of SLDC's recent declaration of Climate Emergency. Cllrs agreed to be mindful of climate issues for all items on the agenda.	
	<u>A National Trust (NT)</u> report was received. Visitor attractions opened for half- term and Low Wray campsite will open for Easter holidays. The NT confirmed with the LDNPA that specific planning permission was not required for the temporary catering provision at Hill Top.	
035/2020	3 members of the public raised a range of concerns about the planning application 7/2020/5042 at The Cottage, High Wray. These included, but were not limited to: overdevelopment at the property; the risk of retrospective application of change of use from a garage to residential use, and the detrimental impact the garage extension would have on the distinctive character and historical balance of High Wray. The council advised the public that more than 8 objections are required for a planning application to be referred to the LDNPA Development Committee, and that several objections from parishioners carry more weight than one objection from the parish council. Any parishioner wishing to attend a Development Committee meeting should include that request in their letter of objection to ensure an invitation.

The B4RN scheme is clearly the better option as it provides the opportunity for fast broadband to every property in the parish and is reasonably priced. All community centres and schools receive free installation and rental. The council agreed to formally support the B4RN proposal as it is cheaper and more inclusive for the whole community. Parishioners were urged to sign up online to support the scheme, one third of homes need to be signed up for B4RN to go ahead and this is more difficult to achieve in an area of high holiday rental/second home ownership.

	surrounding cottages. It is felt that this development will have significant	
	negative impact on that balance and distinctive character. 2) There have been multiple planning applications and development on this site, at least one of which was the planning application for the initial garage, this building was subsequently changed to residential use and the council is	
	concerned that this approach may be taken again with this application. Further, the parish council questions whether a retrospective certificate for change of use was applied for with regards to this previous application.	
	3) Overdevelopment. The application doubles the size of the original garage and intrudes on the outlook of the surrounding cottages and Wray Village Hall. It appears to be equivalent garage space for 7 cars, much more than is necessary for The Cottage, and not in keeping with other cottages of similar nature in the village and the Claife parish, which tend to have 1 or 2 parking spaces at most, if at all.
